Reflection questions

MONDAY: DISPUTE

A dispute also arose among them as to which one of them was to be regarded as the greatest...The greatest among you must become like the youngest, and the leader like one who serves. (Luke 22:24, 26b)

- What are some “disputes” in your life that might keep you from following Jesus this week?
- What acts of service might you offer during Holy Week?

TUESDAY: LET GO

When I sent you out without a purse, bag, or sandals, did you lack anything?...No, not a thing. (Luke 22:35)

- What might you need to let go of in order to follow Jesus this week?

WEDNESDAY: SIGN

When Herod saw Jesus, he was very glad... because he had heard about him and was hoping to see him perform some sign. (Luke 23:8)

- What do you hope Jesus would do for you? What might Jesus hope to do through you this week?

THURSDAY: WEEP

Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me, but weep for yourselves and your children. (Luke 23:28)

- What causes you the most grief in the stories of Jesus’ last week in Jerusalem? Why?

FRIDAY: REMEMBER

Jesus, remember me, when you come into your kingdom...Today you will be with me in Paradise. (Luke 23:42, 43)

- What are some of the things you want to remember as you reflect on the stories of Holy Week?

SATURDAY: JESUS

The centurion...praised God and said, “Certainly this man was innocent.” (Luke 23:47)

- If you could say only one thing about Jesus at the end of this week, what would you say?
